Redgrave Class have had 100% attendance this week – only achieved once before by Akabusi Class earlier in the term!




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




We love to see how our pupils are demonstrating the school values both in and out the classroom! Here is a snapshot of the values in action!

The school has been developing its approach to reading as part of our improvement plan for this academic year. This has involved developing a shared approach to reading in lessons to develop a love of reading and expose our pupils to a wider range of vocabulary and language.

In the Junior School we have launched Accelerated Reader, where pupils read texts and are quizzed on their understanding of texts.
