
Dear Parents and Carers.

It is very important that children are in school every day and on time to ensure that they get the most from their education. This is especially important as, due to Covid, their learning has been disrupted. Attendance is not like a test...If you scored 90% in a test I'm sure you would be happy but 90% attendance is not so great.

Turning up to school on time is important too. Children need the time to settle down, change their reading books, take Accelerated Reader quizzes, complete early work and say hello to their friends before the first lesson. This is all learning time too. If your child is late it can be very unsettling for them and disruptive to the rest of the class.


